10. \* What does the "blank slate" idea mean?

It means that all children are born equal and that only their environment shapes what they become. Mention how some people are born with a musical ability, while others can't carry a tune. Some are artistic, while others can't draw more than a stick man. These are examples that rebut the "blank slate" concept.

- 11. **Knowing** your child is the **key** to handling the day-to-day challenges you face.
- 12. \* What do you think this means?

It means that you need to understand what motivates your child, what discipline she needs, what she responds to, and how she feels and thinks.

13. \* Why do you think this is important in disciplining a child?

Children respond to different things. One child may wilt and cry with just a scolding while the other might dig his heels in and defy you. Each child needs to be disciplined fairly and with balance, but the discipline might be very different depending on their temperament. Only when you KNOW them will you be able to do what works best for them.
